### About the Program

**What do you do when you are faced with a serious business issue?** Members of JWBC's Business Advisory Councils turn to other members of their council for advice and solutions.

Business Advisory Councils (BAC) are facilitated, peer-to-peer mentoring roundtables, which are designed to share ideas, take part in creative brainstorming, network, create a support system, and increase confidence; all in a safe and secure environment.

- Each BAC is facilitated and limited to 14 members.
- The annual fees range from \$250 to \$550
- **\$100 discount based upon active membership in WBO or the Chamber**
- A completed application is required to enroll in this program

### Requirements to apply

- Emerging Business Advisory Council - annual gross revenues of up to \$100,000
- Growth Business Advisory Council - annual gross revenues of \$100,000 to \$1 million
- Accomplished Business Advisory Council - annual gross revenues of over \$1 million
